Health Workforce Subcommittee - Update

- Subcommittee met April 20th
- ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Agreement between Delaware and The Delaware Academy of Medicine effective April 2022:
 - Maximum Award Amount: Up to \$5 million
 - Initial Grant: \$2,275,300 in two equal installments (Half now / Half 1Q2023)
 - Results Contingent Grant: Up to \$2,724,700
 - Other Sources: \$309,000 and counting
